



- On Bowen island The Bowen Island Conservancy published the beautiful Bowen Island Marine Atlas and reached an agreement to protect a 32-acre parcel of waterfront land at Cape Roger Curtis. The lands will be set aside in its natural state as a park for all to enjoy. Metro Vancouver Regional Parks bought Dorman Point to expand the size of Crippen Park. View Bob Turner's latest video on the underwater life following the recovery of Mannion Bay.
- The <u>Squamish River Watershed Society</u> continues to work on restoration and monitoring projects. Together with volunteers they recently planted over 100 native plants for bank stabilization and habitat restoration and painted over 30 salmon for the "Way of the Salmon" trail.
- <u>SeaChange Marine Conservation</u> Society continued with eelgrass planting in nearshore areas of Bowen and Keats Islands. They are also working with the <u>Nicholas Sonntag Marine Education Centre</u> with marine debris removal in Gibsons Harbor and Plumper Cove.
- Volunteers managed a difficult removal of styrofoam from North Beach on Anvil Island thanks to financial support from the Sunshine Coast Regional District.
- CBC Gem begins streaming the documentary <u>Moonless Oasis</u> October 30th. The document is about deep diving the Howe Sound Glass Sponge Reefs.
- Fisheries and Oceans Canada is starting stakeholder consultations regarding protection measures for the five new Glass Sponge reefs and three sponge gardens that have been confirmed in the west side of the Sound.

#### **#11 Sustainable Cities and Communities**

- The Greater Sea-to-Sky and Howe Sound Community Foundations have produced <u>A Vital Explorations report</u>. This report highlights some of the pressures experienced throughout the region, and is aimed at catalyzing conversations to better understand the issues, and identify potential solutions and region-wide responses.
- Town of Gibsons won the 2020 Community Excellence Award by the Union of BC Municipalities for its eco-assets strategy. It was <u>recognized</u> for excellence in asset management and strategy that treats the natural environment as part of the town's infrastructure.
- The District of Squamish and <u>Squamish Helping Hands Society</u>
  have worked in partnership with BC Housing to create a new "Under One
  Roof' facility that offers the Squamish community improved and
  centralized access to food, shelter and support services. The Market
  rescues an average of 3600 lbs of food each week donated to Squamish
  Helping Hands by local grocery stores and restaurants. This helps to
  protect the planet and strives for zero food waste in Squamish.
