



### What is the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development?

Stewardship of the Province's Crown Land and resources that reflects the diverse values and interests of all British Columbians.









- The BC Provincial Government has direct authority over 94% of the land and natural resources in British Columbia.
- The Region and Districts administer the land and resources through authority granted in legislation and policy.












#### **First Nations**

- •There are 634 First Nations in Canada.
- •There are 198 distinct First Nations in BC
- •57 First Nations have asserted traditional territories which overlap the Chilliwack Natural Resource District (1 Treaty)
- •34 of these communities reside in the District.
- •42 First Nations hold forestry revenue and/or consultation agreements within the District (FCRSA, SDM, IFA, SSEA)









# Forest Licensee Responsibilities:

- Develop a Forest Stewardship Plan that addresses these values (defined in Forest and Range Practices Act)
- Develop harvesting and road proposals consistent with this plan and legislation
- Obtain specific cutting or road permits
- Carry out primary forest activities including reforestation






#### **Constraints Map**










# Wood Lake Fire

- ~1300 ha area
- Fire Costs estimated at \$500,000/day
- Post Wildfire Risk Assessment
- Assess stewardship values
- Potential salvage
- Reforestation options




Note: Burn severity has been visually derived from helicopter observations, ground observations, and limit
