 Watershed protection and monitoring proposal for Chaster Creek Watershed (salmon-bearing streams), tributaries impacted by logging. Climate Resiliency Strategy being updated (looking at GHG emissions target, carbon neutral plans, natural asset management, etc) → \$73,000/year in funding for four years 	
 District of West Vancouver Proposal to develop Climate Action Strategy (with new IPPC targets to reduce GHG emissions, adaptation, protection of natural assets, carbon budgeting framework for corporate decisions) 1.5% environmental levy on taxes, amounts to ~\$1.2 million/year towards climate action. was approved by council → moved into environment reserve fund bylaw in July 2022 (can use for community programs, strategy, reserves fund for action plan) Adopted foreshore development permit area last spring for private properties, now looking at how to protect public amenities and district infrastructure from flooding and sea level rise, hopefully using nature-based solutions (for e.g. Ambleside Park) Final stages of the urban forest management plan (actions to increase declining tree canopy cover and improvements to our tree bylaws and regulations) At UBCM, Climate and Energy Action Award in climate adaptation category presented to DWV for foreshore policy

Difficult for people on small islands (Bowyer, Passage, Anvil) to get rid of larger items that need to be disposed of (e.g. appliances, mattresses) Will be back in Howe Sound 6 years from now, the same opportunity for collaboration with local governments Works with solid waste staff on properly recycling, lots of chemicals too. Lots of background sorting. Metro Vancouver coordinates with staff at Transfer Stations (facilities that deal with boat disposal, Terra Pure, BC Tire Stewardship, etc). Every item is different. Not a straightforward process.
